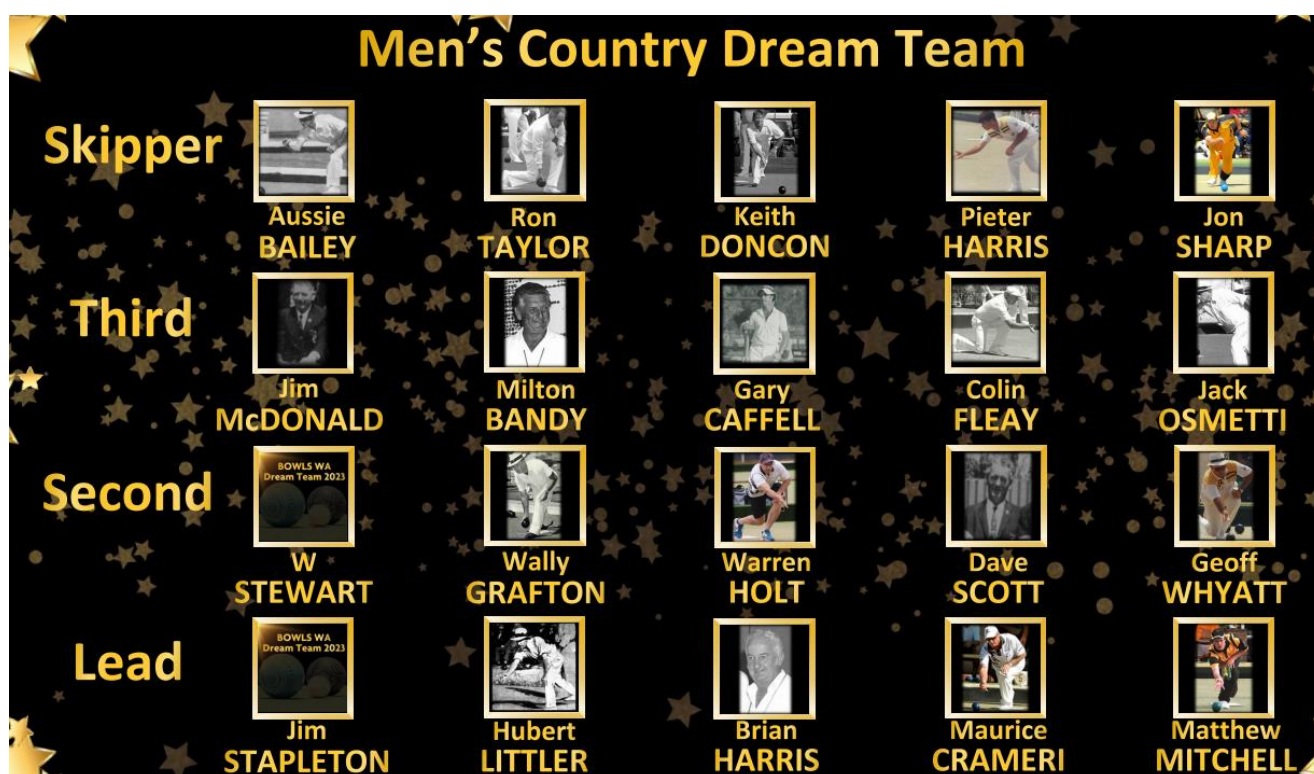


## Newsletter 3 June 2023
